**Casa Lebrija**  
Casa Lebrija is one of the finest 'traditional houses' in Seville and contains the extremely impressive collection of the Countess of Lebrija. Including 580 square meters of mosaic Roman floor and wall (the largest private collection in the world) and many archaeological treasures of incalculable value including glasses, columns, vases and sculptures.

**Fine Art Museum**  
The museum was founded in 1839 and houses a collection of mainly Spanish visual arts from the medieval period to the early 20th century, including a choice selection of works from the so-called Golden Age of Sevillian painting during the 17th century, such as Murillo, Zurbarán, Francisco de Herrera the younger, and Valdés Leal. The museum also offers beautiful architecture particularly the ceiling and the cupola.

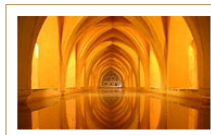


**The Old Jewish Quarter**  
Five hundred years have passed since the descendants of Abraham worshiped in the synagogues of Seville but the area still bears their name. The Juderia, with its narrow, whitewashed alleys, tiled patios and outdoor cafes, has become one of the premier tourist attractions in all of Spain.



#### Alcázar of Seville

The impressive royal palace in Seville was originally a Moorish fort. The palace is one of the best remaining examples of Mudéjar architecture.
